All member churches of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches are notified and invited to attend the 67th Annual Meeting and Conference of the NACCC, beginning Saturday, June 19, and closing Sunday evening, June 20, 2021.

The Reverend Ed and Mrs. Jami Backell, 2021 Annual Meeting & Conference Host Committee Co-Chairs and the Pacific Northwest Association, which is comprised of churches from both Washington and Oregon, along with the leadership and staff of the NACCC, are planning a joyous meeting to conduct our business, learn from workshops and lectures, hear updates from our missionaries, spend time with one another socializing, and worship together.

Highlights will include: The Rev. Dr. Mary (Mimi) Biedron, as the Congregational Lecturer. Mimi is the Senior Minister of North Congregational Church in Farmington Hill, Michigan. The Bible Lecturer, Dr. David Clark, is writer of eight books and dozens of articles, and former Dean of Bethel University. He now serves the wider church through consulting and public speaking.

GENERAL INFO

Registration

- There is no registration fee, but registration is required and necessary to connect via Zoom. Please watch for registration instructions that will be posted in early March on the Annual Meeting page of our Website: www.naccc.org. You will have an option to make a donation to help offset the cost of this important annual event.
- All necessary information and voting documents will be available on our Website. Please continue to watch for updates.
- The Delegate and Alternate must be able to connect via Zoom to vote. A person connecting via phone, will not be able to vote.
- Only Registered Delegates, [OR Registered Alternates if your Church's Delegate cannot be present], may vote.

Delegate and Alternate Certificates

Attention Churches – Assign a Delegate and Alternate and return the signed Credentials Cards. Delegates and Alternates will not be certified without a signed credentials card on file with the NACCC office. Certification is required before a Delegate or Alternate can vote at the Annual Meeting & Conference. Credentials cards will be mailed to the churches and need to be signed by an officer of the church. You may also print Delegate and Alternate Cards from the NACCC Website: www.naccc.org; click on the 2021 Annual Meeting graphic. **Signed Credentials Cards must be received at the NACCC Office no later than 5:00pm Central Time on Saturday, May 1, 2021.**

2021 Standing Rules

- A "Virtual" Annual Meeting and Conference will be held by the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches on Saturday, June 19 and Sunday, June 20, 2021, with the business session to take place on June 19 at 1:00 p.m. CDT. The following standing rules will be used to conduct the meeting:
- **All Delegates and Alternate Delegates need to be registered with Carrie Dahm at the NACCC office; email cdahm@naccc.org no later than 5:00 p.m. Central Time on Saturday, May 1, 2021.** Registration needs to include an email address for the Delegate and Alternate Delegate.
- Only registered Delegates (or Alternate Delegates if the Delegate is unavailable) will be allowed to vote on NACCC motions.
- All Annual Meeting materials, including the meeting agenda, will be provided to member churches in advance of the meeting.
- To obtain the floor, a person should "virtually" raise their hand and be recognized by the presiding officer, and then give his/her name and church affiliation before speaking.
- No person shall speak in debate more than twice on the same question or longer than two minutes each time; nor shall any person be recognized to debate for the second time unless those who have not previously spoken on the question have been recognized.

2021 Emergency By-Laws

Whereas the face to face meeting scheduled for June 19 through June 22, 2021 in Spokane, Washington has been canceled due to continuing health concerns caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, the Board of Directors of the NACCC, as allowed by Chapter 181 of the State of Wisconsin Statutes, adopts these emergency bylaws to call for a "virtual" Annual Meeting. This motion waives applicable paragraph or sentence of the Bylaws of the NACCC, Article III. Meetings of the Member Churches, and calls for the 67th Annual Meeting of the NACCC to take place on June 19 and 20, 2021 by "virtual" video conferencing with the virtual business meeting on June 19 at 1:00 p.m. CDT. Business to be conducted shall include: Approval of prior year minutes; Ratification of Board of Directors and Leadership Council actions; Election of directors, officers, council and committee members as nominated; Approval of the 2021/2022 Budget; and any other business to be brought before the membership. **New business and nominations usually made from the floor during the meeting shall be received by the NACCC office no later than 5:00 p.m. CDT on Tuesday, June 1, 2021.** These emergency bylaws will be in effect until July 30, 2021.
