The building was the heart of ECHO's ministry throughout the 1980's, housing offices, the Seed Bank, and small apartments. We are excited for the next era of the A-Frame! Work has begun to remodel the building to include high-capacity downstairs kitchen – making cooking and cleaning for groups more efficient and cost-effective. The second floor will offer bunkhouse-style accommodations for larger groups who want to serve and learn, but do not currently have space at ECHO's campus. We are looking for donations of used (but excellent condition) kitchen fixtures.

Mission workers mobilized 123 volunteers for four days of blitz rehabbing of a building donated to the Women's Help Center where women in crisis, along with their children, are given care in a safe environment and preparation to re-enter the world. The building was ready for dedication by mid-Maundy Thursday. The dedication included presentations of a loaf of bread symbolizing the body of Christ, a Bible, and a Blueprint of Jesus poster which also hangs in the buildings at Hosanna. The Center was then presented keys to the building. Because there were so many volunteers, additional work was done on another building. From Rev. Jim Owens, Director: On March 20th, I made a trip to Miami to ship 27 boxes of clothes and choir robes to Haiti. Our next shipment will go in August and will include items for Christmas. This year, Christmas came in April to our two locations in Port-au-Prince. We are still working on getting items flown down to Maniche. Ezechiel (Haitian Director) found a driver to take the shipped items to Maniche but the driver wanted \$600.00 USD to drive because gas stations are still very short on fuel so prices are high and he would have to pay off gangs to travel the road over the mountain. This ministry is not about to support the gangs' lifestyle, so we will pay the cost and use a local commuter airline to fly the cargo.
