6/14/22 REV. GISELA GERDES

Gisela Gerdes, 87, passed away on June 14, 2022 at age 87. Born in 1934 in Berlin, Germany, she attended seminary, receiving her certification as a teacher of religious education and then teaching in Berlin. She was married to Egon Gerdes from 1958 to 1981. She was a missionary in the Congo in 1961 and taught Christian education in Nashville starting in 1963. Gisela worked for several different churches in Illinois, as youth leader and director of Christian education. She was ordained in 1989 and in 1991, moved to Los Angeles/Glendale and served as associate minister. While in California, she proudly became an American citizen. She served on the NACCC's Christian Education Commission, 1990-94, and the Missionary Society 1996-1999.
